
Stay informed with online outage map

When an outage affects over 250 members, an outage update is posted at **www.mvec.net/outage** and on our Facebook page.

Click on the dot near your location for expanded information. When time allows, our dispatcher will post comments and estimated restoration times. Please note: do not report outages on Facebook or X as those two sites are not monitored 24/7.

When the power goes out, so do our linemen!

Be patient. Winter conditions pose hazards for us, too. Decreased visibility, icy roads, hard-to-reach places and an increase in auto accidents can make middle-of-the night outage restoration more difficult.



Make sure your phone numbers are current

If your two most-used phone numbers are in MVEC's records, our automated phone system will be able to identify your location when you call or text in an outage. This helps our dispatchers send crews to needed areas and speeds up power restoration. You can easily fill out a phone number update form at www.mvec.net/power-outages/update-phone

How to report an outage

WHEN THE POWER GOES OUT at your home or business, MVEC offers several easy ways for you to notify us. By reporting your outage, you are helping us get the power back on as quickly and safely as possible.



1. Text: Report an outage quickly by sending a text message to **855-963-3830.** Text OUT to report the outage and text STATUS to request an update. Just make sure the phone number in your SmartHub account is enabled to receive messages.



2. SmartHub: The Report an Outage quick link makes it easy for registered users of SmartHub to report outages on the SmartHub home page or app. To learn more, visit mvec.smarthub.coop



3. Phone: Call MVEC at **952-492-8255 or 1-800-232- 2328**. Your information is

automatically added to our outage reporting system. If you stay on the line, you always have the option to talk with a Dispatcher.

Monitor your electric usage by the day, week or month and compare to previous time periods.

Registering for a free account is simple. You just need to have your member account number handy and follow the instructions at **www.mvec.net/smarthub**. Informational videos show how to sign up and use SmartHub.

ORU trustees give local food and gift programs a holiday boost

Through the generosity of MVEC members who round up their monthly electric bills, the Operation Round Up Trust Board was able to give \$56,362 in the Fourth Quarter of 2024
